Diaz Contemporary is pleased to present Measured, featuring the work of Georgina Bringas, Marla Hlady, Karen Kraven, Kristiina Lahde and Francine Savard, curated by Claire Christie, opening on Thursday, January 28 from 6 to 8pm and continuing until February 20.

Measurement can be generally understood as the quantifying of something, expressed as a system of units. Applied as a method of describing the world we inhabit, from length to magnitude, weather to wealth, measurement is an abbreviation that is simultaneously explanatory and codified. Each of the artists in the exhibition pauses at this juncture of the abstracted and explained and, from within the range of their respective practices, proposes a kind of sensorial reading of systematized analysis.

Georgina Bringas (Mexico City) earned her Bachelor of Arts at the National School of Painting, Sculpture and Printmaking "La Esmeralda" in Mexico City. Recent exhibitions include Nada esta inmovil; todo se mueve, todo vibra at Galeria Central Museo Universitario del Chopo, Mexico (2014) and El lugar donde sucedemos: Midiendo un muro con tiempo at Galeria Nueveochenta, Bogota, Columbia (2013). Her work has been included in exhibitions at Kunstlerhaus Bethanien, Berlin, Museo de Arte Moderno, Mexico City, and IILA Video Art Competition, Rome.

Marla Hlady (Toronto) received her BFA from the University of Victoria and her MFA from York University. Recent exhibitions include Perdre Pied... (Losing One's Footing) at the Biennale nationale de sculpture contemporaine, Trois-Rivieres, Quebec (2014), Volume: Hear Here at Justina M. Barnicke Gallery, U of T, Toronto (2013), Circling the Inverse Square at the Kitchener Waterloo Art Gallery (2013) and Hallwalls Contemporary Art Center, Buffalo (2012).
